Paints

I recommend you buy only the following colors to begin Class:

Cadmium Yellow

Lemmon Yellow

Cadmium Red Light

Alizarine Crimson Permanent

Ultramarine Blue

Viridian Green

Sap Green

others you would like.... Some of my Students have used the new "Water Soluable or Miscable Oils" These are acceptable...and do not require you to use any solvents....and mix and clean up with water. Some people like them and their working qualities are similar to oils...but not exactly. If you get these do not buy Liquin or Gamblin Galkyd, please buy a medium specific to the Water Miscable Oils.

Brushes

Please buy good hog bristle brushes. I recommend Winsor Newton-Wilton Oil/Acrylic Brushes, Princeton Series 5200, Winsor Newton Lexington II Series, Grumbacher Gainsborough 1271 Series, Robert Simmons Series 40 Signet Bristle. They should have long "Oil brush" handles (craft brushes have short handles).

These are a range of sizes I recommend:

- * Hog Bristle Brushes, "Flats " #2, 4, 6, 8,
- * "Round" Hog Bristle Brushes size #4, 6, 10
- * "Filberts" in #4, 6 and 8
- * Any brushes you have from previous class

Other Items

12 X 16 Masterson Pallet seal

Picture glass cut to 12x16 (you can use glass from a cheap frame) Don't drop it...Cut to fit into your Masterson pallet seal, and a brown paper bag cut to fit under this. Please do not buy a paper pallet...

Odorless turpentine or paint thinner, small can (I insist.....some people, myself included, get headaches from the odor of Turpentine)

Two glass jars with lids (jelly size is fine)

Bar of bath soap in a plastic bag

Metal Pallet knife... with small point

Paper Towels or Soft Rags (tee-shirts cut up work well)

Liquin or Gamblin Galkyd. Medium is used to thin paint and makes it faster drying while not losing its body as you do when you thin with turpentine. Check for a Water Soluble Medium if you are using water soluble paints

Canvas Pad size: 12X16 or 11x 14 this will be used for lessons in which you will learn to mix colors, use brushes and experiment with different painting techniques and styles.

2 Canvas size 16x 20 or less, your choice.

Old shirt or apron.

Yard stick (cheap from Lowes or Home Depot)

Please bring a sketch book and pencils to class each day for notes .

Soft vine Charcoal or 6B Charcoal Pencil

Kneadable eraser
