


## SUPPLY LIST – NANCY FRANKE WORKSHOP



7 - 8 stretched canvases or boards...Linen (rather than cotton duck) pre-stretched or linen on board are preferable. Suggested sizes are 9 x 12, 12 x 12, 11 x 14, 12 x 16, 16 x 20 or 16 x 16, so you can complete several studies in one session. For linen boards, good sources are:

[www.raymarart.com](http://www.raymarart.com) or [www.newtraditionsartpanels.com](http://www.newtraditionsartpanels.com). From New Traditions, I get the C-15 linen on gatorboard, which I love. Fredrix linen boards (acrylic primed) are acceptable too!

Paints: (I like Gamblin , Utrecht, sometimes Lukas paint)... Basically, we are using a limited palette...red, blue and yellow. The suggestions below give a warm and cool of each.

*\* denotes colors I typically use*

\*Cadmium Yellow Lemon

Cadmium Yellow Medium

\*Cadmium Red Medium (Utrecht) or Vermillion (Lukas)

\*Alizarin Crimson

\*Ultramarine Blue

Cerulean Blue Hue (optional)

\*Titanium White, Lukas 1862, large tube, or Titanium Zinc White (Gamblin)

Medium (Liquin), optional

Brushes: Silver Bristlon, (which are synthetic ) brights in various sizes are great brushes. I also like Rosemary Brushes, Ivory Series, long flats or short flats. You can get Rosemary Brushes (which are from England) by Googling online for US Dealers. Bring **WHAT YOU LIKE**, and maybe add one or two of the above to try. Also, get one or two large (i.e. 12, 16, or even bigger) brushes. Lately, I have been enjoying the Egbert shaped brush as well. Bring a Palette Knife too.

Cup or brush washer for solvent ( **Gamsol or Turpenoid only**);,

Palette, at least 12 x 16, of glass if possible. If you use a paper palette, make sure it's grey, not white.

PORTABLE EASEL

Vine charcoal;

2 rolls of paper towels (I like Viva)

#### **AND DON'T FORGET -**

THINGS TO PAINT: Bring a crock or vase, cup or plate, piece of fruit or glass, also dolls or toys, shoes, purses, whatever; that is, bring a few SIMPLE yet interesting things that you like...we will mix it up and set up simple vignettes . If you have good things blooming, cut some branches.
