In search of sharks teeth on Ponte Verdra Beach, my son discovered his first oyster shell in August of 2015. His excitement caused me to take pause, and truly see God's beautiful creation. Please tell us about your art. I studied and graduated with a BFA in Sculpture from University of Georgia. Currently, I am working with acrylics on canvas and watercolors on paper. My subject matter ranges from abstract to an expressive study of objects in nature. I have three very inquisitive children, and often times I see the world in a different way through their eyes.
